*60 min reset required if more than one class booked.


** 4 adult helpers required

Benefits of Art Play for Children



At Bundabubs, we believe that a relaxed & calm environment has the power to promote mindfulness and self-motivation. As children immerse themselves in the artistic process, they not only create masterpieces but also build confidence in their abilities. Learning through play is at the heart of what we do, targeting skill development in a way that feels like pure fun.

Key Skills:

- Fine motor skills
- Co-ordination
- Concentration
- Language skills
- Decision making (adapting and pivoting ideas)
- Independence and autonomy

- Mindfulness

Independent painting (20-25 mins)

Colour mixing: A chance to explore & experiment with colour, using the primary colours and white.

Painting: Different sized brushes and painting tools are available to be used to create a totally unique painting. Decoration: Gems, glitter and glue are available to add a little something extra to their painting.

Collaborative Painting (20 - 25 mins)

This activity gets messy! Children are encouraged to use their hands, feet, whole body for painting!

Extra large canvases/boxes

Paint tools: large brushes, scrapers, squeegees, bubble wrap etc

Large tubes of paint for children to play with.



Alternative Options



Craft Table

An opportunity to play with craft and collage materials to their heart's content.

Sensory Trays

Chickpeas, kinetic sand, pasta, gloop, fizzing potions, water, you name it we can usually do it!

Canvas bags

Option to paint and decorate a canvas tote bag using fabric paints, stencils and pens.

Splatter paint

Splatter and spray painting onto giant canvas sheets.

All art materials


Low tables (crates and mdf panels)
